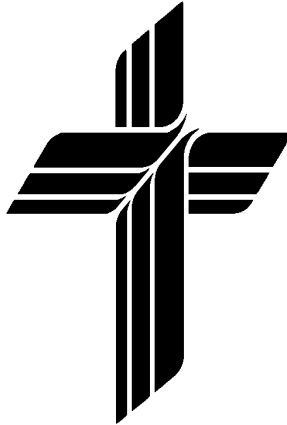

Our purpose: Faith Lutheran Church exists to share with all, God's love through Christ and His promise of salvation!

As We Gather... Philip Nicolai is a man for our times. The man who authored the hymn of the day "Wake, Awake, for Night is Flying" wrote this hymn in the midst of an epidemic which killed more than 1,400 of the town's 2,500 inhabitants. He remarked that at times he was burying more than thirty people per day. Yet in the midst of this epidemic he completed his work "Mirror of the Joys of Eternal Life" which contains the hymn "Wake, Awake, for Night is Flying." This hymn is based off of Matthew 25:1–13, the parable of the ten virgins which is our Gospel text for today. We don't know when the bridegroom is coming, but like Philip Nicolai, we can wait with joy, even in the midst of adverse circumstances.
