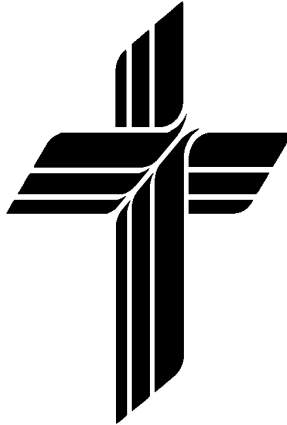

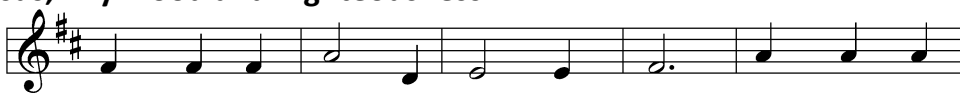
Our purpose: Faith Lutheran Church exists to share with all, God's love through Christ and His promise of salvation!

Semper Gaudete—Always Rejoice! (1 Thess. 5:16)

The third Sunday in Advent is known as “rejoice” Sunday. Thus, we light the rose candle in the Advent wreath symbolizing the joy that Jesus the Messiah is near. Various branches of the U.S. armed forces have “Semper” mottos. The Marines: Semper Fidelis (Always Faithful), The Navy: Semper Fortis (Always Courageous), The Space Force: Semper Supra (Always Above), The Coast Guard: Semper Paratus (Always Ready).

The Christ’s Church on Earth is called the Church Militant, and indeed we as Christians spiritually fight the forces of evil. As God’s “army,” we too have a “Semper” motto. Semper Gaudete. Always rejoice! 2020 has brought many hardships, but we can *semper gaudete* through our Savior who brings us joy.

One thing that many members have lamented is the inability to have the same fellowship that we once had. Before COVID, one service where everyone is in the same place allowed for everyone to be “in the loop.” Now we’re spread out online and through multiple in-person services. There are probably some fellow Faith Lutheran members you haven’t seen since March!

My usual practice is to have a new member ceremony to help introduce new members to our congregation. With COVID precautions in place, that has not been able to happen especially in the second half of this year. In place of this, I am working with volunteers and our secretary to assemble a display of new members’ photos in the shadow box in the narthex. Until then, I also want us to take a moment—a *semper gaudete* moment—to reflect on how good the Lord has been to us this year.

We know that the Father works through the Word and Sacrament delivered by the Holy Spirit to grow Christ's Church. Any joys we experience we can simply say, to God alone be the glory! We also know that Church growth is not all about numbers. Even in a church that might have not changed numerically in a year, the Lord can work to increase and strengthen the members' faithfulness which is not so easily measured but is just as important.

Church membership isn't about having your name in the right electronic database. It's not about being part of the right club. Church membership is your public confession of who Jesus is and what He has done in your life. At Faith Lutheran Church, membership is your way of saying that you agree with the teachings of the Bible and you believe in the Triune God who comes to us in Word and Sacrament.

Dear members of Faith Lutheran Church, on this "rejoice" Sunday let us then always rejoice (*semper gaudete!*) in the Lord's blessings. In particular, let us rejoice that **20 souls** have confessed that our God is their God, and that our Lord is their Lord and have joined us officially as members of Faith Lutheran.
